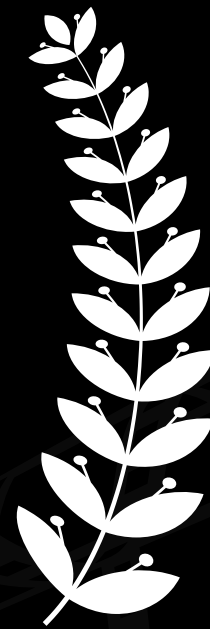

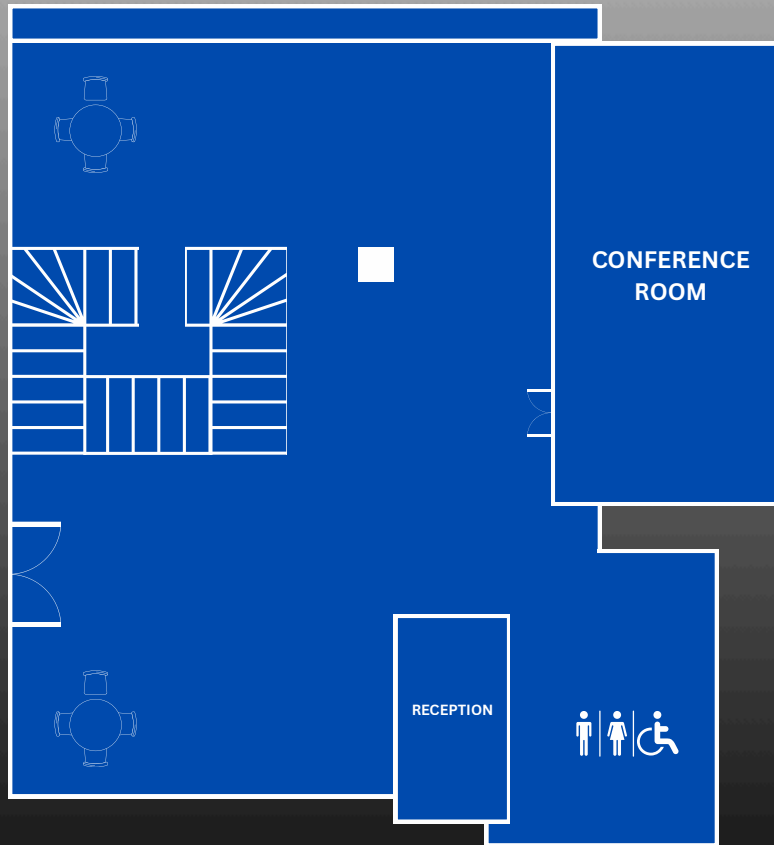

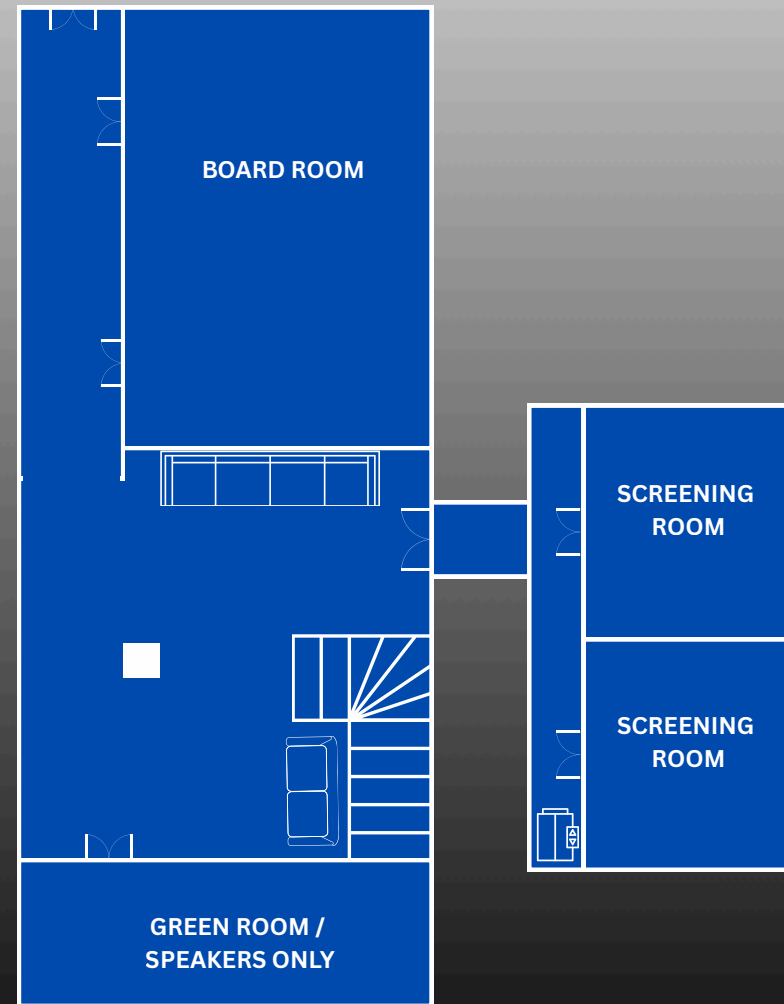

Little Flix London Film Festival welcomes 21 industry speakers from across film and television, sharing their expertise through insightful talks, practical workshops, and interactive sessions designed to inspire the next generation of storytellers.

SUSANNE FARRELL FILM /TV WRITER



Susanne Farrell is a Northern Irish, London-based screenwriter working across film and television. She is the co-creator of the BBC and BritBox crime drama *Hope Street*. Her debut feature, *Dirty God*, premiered in competition at the Sundance Film Festival to critical acclaim, while *Drift* (2024), starring Cynthia Erivo, premiered at Sundance and won the FIPRESCI Prize.

MO ALI FILM & TV DIRECTOR



Mo Ali is an acclaimed British director known for prestige drama and elevated genre storytelling. His recent credits include *Hijack* (Apple TV+), *COBRA: Cyberwar* (Sky), and *Virdee* (BBC One). Following the success of *Shank and Montana*, he continues to develop ambitious original dramas with leading UK writers and producers.

SELMA NICHOLLS CASTING DIRECTOR



Selma Nicholls is an award-winning London-based casting director and founder of Looks Like Me Casting, a pioneering company championing diversity and authentic representation. Her credits include Beyoncé's Grammy Award-winning "Brown Skin Girl," Netflix's "Queen Charlotte" campaign, and projects for Disney. She is on the board of the Casting Directors Association and a member of the Casting Directors' Guild.

Nicola Gregory is a BAFTA-nominated British-Canadian producer working across premium scripted television and film. She is best known for producing the critically acclaimed comedy-drama series *Dreaming Whilst Black* for BBC Three, A24, and Showtime.

KERRI DAVENPORT-BURTON WRITER/DIRECTOR



Kerri Davenport-Burton is an award-winning British writer, director, and script consultant based in London. She graduated with Distinction from the prestigious National Film and Television School (NFTS). She is best known for her BIFA-nominated feature documentary *100 Doors* and her acclaimed short films, including *That Thing You Drew*.

YUSUF S ABDUL-QADIR FILMMAKER



Yusuf S Abdul-Qadir is an independent filmmaker, tech producer, and prominent civil rights advocate who operates at the intersection of technology, justice, and storytelling. He is known for his work in creating socially driven digital content, developing innovative vertical dramas, and leading initiatives like the CNY Ethical AI Creator Lab.

KALUNGI SSEBANDEKE



Kalungi Ssebandeke is a multi-award-winning London-based playwright, actor and director whose work is celebrated for its powerful Black-centred storytelling. Best known for his acclaimed debut play *Assata Taught Me*, his writing credits also include *Prodigal* and *Black Terror*. A Guildhall-trained performer, he has appeared in productions across stage and screen, including *Doctor Who*. In 2023, he won the prestigious JMK Directing Award for his acclaimed production of *Meetings* at the Orange Tree Theatre.

MASKELAH GABRIEL-ADAMS SALES AGENT



Maskelah Gabriel-Adams is a London-based filmmaker, sales agent, and the founder of AfroFilms UK, an agency championing Black British films on the global stage. She frequently engages with the independent creative community, operating out of the London area.

KAREN FEATHERSTONE SCREENWRITER



Karen Featherstone is an award-winning British screenwriter, Access Coordinator, and industry script reader. She is highly recognized in the UK television and film industry for her consultancy work, advocating for disability representation, and has participated as a shadow script editor on schemes like Channel 4's 4Screenwriting.

Octavia McKenzie is an award-winning screenwriter, published author, and film director based in London. She is the Head of Script Development at the UK microdrama production company, Onset Octopus, and is best known for pioneering independently financed vertical video series (such as Cowboy After Dark) for international distribution.

Derren Lawford is an award-winning British media executive and executive producer with over 20 years of experience across broadcasting, streaming, and digital content. He is recognised for his commitment to mission-led programming and championing diverse and emerging talent.

KARIMAH ZAKIA ISSA FILM & TV PRODUCER



Karimah Zakia Issa is an award-winning Canadian filmmaker, writer, and director based in London and Toronto. Issa's work explores themes of identity, self-worth, and queer experience through a Black female lens. Issa directed Peak Male Excellence (produced by Joi Productions for BBC Three) and directed a micro-interview series on female founders for Porsche.

LESLIE ANNE MACFARLANE PRODUCER



Lesley-Anne Macfarlane is a Trinidadian-born, British-based narrative and documentary film producer known for championing underrepresented perspectives and multi-heritage stories. She co-founded Far Lane Media and FILMCO, a social enterprise dedicated to sustaining the Caribbean film ecosystem.

SABIA KIA FILM & TV PRODUCER



Saba Kia is an award-winning Iranian-born producer based in the UK, known for her work across film and television. She currently serves as an associate producer on Series 4 of Gangs of London and heads the SWANA and Africa division at Joi Productions. Her credits include producing Ashley Walters' directorial debut BOYS for Sky Arts and collaborating with leading independent production companies across the UK.

JULES LAI FABSTIR FOUNDER/CTO



Jules Lai is a London-based filmmaker, creative technology entrepreneur, and the founder and CTO of Fabstir, a Web3 platform built to decentralise film distribution and payment infrastructure. Before fully dedicating himself to media tech, Lai used his degrees in computing and mathematics to build financial modelling software for institutions like the Bank of England and Lloyd's of London.

She is widely recognised as the first UK casting director to pioneer casting for vertical/micro-drama formats, and also casts for television, commercials, film, and music videos. She operates her own independent agency, Liyanne Marie Casting.

Katrina Smith-Jackson is an award-winning British screenwriter, script researcher and screenwriting lecturer working across television, film and digital media. Her credits include EastEnders, Hollyoaks, Waterloo Road and the award-winning children's series JoJo & Gran Gran. Alongside her writing career, she lectures in screenwriting, helping to shape the next generation of storytellers.

JOSEPH TRUSSON



Joseph Trusson is a UK-based associate producer specialising in film sales, acquisitions and international distribution.
